HANNAH—SHIP IN A BOTTLE

When General George Washington took command of the Continental Army, there was no Continental Navy to fight the mighty British Navy. So George Washington bought the schooner Hannah, which in July 1775 became the first ship commissioned by the Continental Army in 1775. The Hannah, a 78-ton fishing schooner, went under the command of Nicholas Broughton and armed with only four cannon, she was sent to capture badly needed gun powder from British ships.



Amati's Hannah ship-in-a-bottle kit uses the bread and butter construction method. Several wooden pieces, die-cut to exact dimension, are layered and glued to form the solid hull. Decks, bulwarks, masts, skylights, guns and anchor are white metal, with many other details in photo-etched brass. Complete with cotton sails and rigging line, the kit also includes a glass bottle and the special tools you need for getting the model inside.
